



CITY OF MART – MAYOR LEONARD WILLIAMS

DATE ISSUED: June 29, 2020

WHEREAS, in December 2019, a novel coronavirus, now designated Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19), was detected in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared a national emergency regarding COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, Governor Greg Abbott declared a state of disaster due to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, I, Leonard Williams, Mayor of the City of Mart, have determined that extraordinary and immediate measures must be taken to respond quickly to prevent and slow down community spread of COVID-19; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY LEONARD WILLIAMS, MAYOR OF THE CITY OF MART, TEXAS, AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF MART, TEXAS:

1. All persons who are present within the jurisdiction of the City of Mart are to wear a clean face covering any time they are, or will be, in contact with other people who are not household members in public spaces where it is not possible to maintain social distance.
2. A face covering is a material that covers the nose and mouth. It can be secured to the head with ties or strips or simply wrapped around the lower face. It can be made of a variety of materials, such as cotton, silk or linen.
3. Acceptable, reusable face covering options for the general public include: bandanas, neck gaiters, homemade face coverings, scarves, or tightly woven fabric such as cotton T-shirts and some types of towels.
4. Face coverings are not required:
 - i. For people whose religious beliefs prevent them from wearing a face covering.
 - ii. For those who cannot wear a face covering due to a medical or behavioral condition.
 - iii. For children under 10 years old.
 - iv. When consuming food or drink.
 - v. In private, individual offices.

- vi. In settings where it is not practical or feasible to wear a face covering, including when obtaining or rendering goods or services, such as the receipt of dental services or while swimming.
 - vii. While with members of a family of the same household.
 - viii. While driving alone or with passengers who are part of the same household.
 - ix. While pumping gas or operating outdoor equipment
5. Failure to comply constitutes an imminent threat to public health.
